The ITUC 'Count Us In! campaign engages men and women to bring about change: more women in trade union leadership positions and concerted efforts to organise and mobilise them in unions. Campaign Goal 1: 100 ITUC affiliates to subscribe to the "Count us in!" Campaign by the 3rd ITUC Congress (Berlin, Germany, May 2014)

Campaign Goal 2: 80% of ITUC General Council member organisations to have at least 30% of women in their decision making bodies by the 4th ITUC

Congress in 2018

**Campaign Goal 3**: 5% increase of women's membership in each national centre that has subscribed to the "Count us in!" Campaign by the 4th ITUC Congress in 2018


