<u>2012</u>

In 2012 thousands of actions, meetings and events were organised until the very last month: on 12-12-12 (12 December 2012) actions took place in more than 50 countries around the world (summary attached). Your actions around the world led to multiple results including:

- 8 countries who ratified ILO Convention No. 189: Uruguay Philippines Mauritius – Italy (officially registered at the ILO) and Nicaragua – Bolivia – Paraguay – Colombia (who finished their ratification process at national level and need to officially register at the ILO)
- A number of governments who improved their laws to better protect domestic workers, including: Chile, where the working time of domestic workers was regulated by law; Spain, which granted them access to social protection; Brazil, where the constitution was amended in order to facilitate the adoption of the Convention; Singapore, which granted a day off a week to domestic workers; Vietnam, where a new Labour Code was adopted recognizing for the first time domestic work; and Malawi, where the minimum wage for domestic workers was increased.
- More domestic workers joined a union and new unions were established in Paraguay, the Dominican Republic, Egypt, Angola and Sri Lanka.

The action platform KA PPRT (with KSBSI, Jala-PRT, KSPI and KSPSI) organised demonstrations on 29 November and 12 December to demand the adoption of the Domestic Workers Bill and ratification of C189.

On 13-12-12 the Indonesian Parliament decided to schedule two draft bills on domestic

workers rights as a priority for their agenda in 2013: a) the protection of domestic workers and b) revision law no. 39 year 2004 on replacement and protection of Indonesian migrant workers. Italy:

First European country to ratify C189

Ratification of C189 – 12-12-12: An important victory for trade unions and domestic

workers in Italy. On December 18 2012, at the Conference of the Italian trade unions CGIL, CISL and UIL, hosted by the ILO, the Labour Minister Elsa Fornero announced that Italy will ratify soon. A few hours later that day, the foreign ministry confirmed that both the Italian President Giorgio Napolitano and the Foreign Affairs Minister Giulio Terzi had signed. Italy is the first country in the EU to ratify the Convention - thanks to the efforts of the Italian trade unions and domestic workers, but also with the cooperation of the Ministries of Labour and Foreign Affairs, as well political forces. At the event on 18 December the Migration Team from Caritas Internationalis and ACLI-COLF were present as well.

MTUC kicked of its '12 by 12' campaign on Wednesday 5th December 2012: Malaysia calling upon the government to ratify Convention 189 to ensure decent work for domestic workers. They handed over a Memorandum and expressed dissatisfaction and disgust over the latest revelation of extensive abuse, illtreatment and illegal imprisonment of 105 domestic workers which is clearly in violation of the Anti-Trafficking in Persons Act. MTUC stressed the need for the government to either enact a new law for the domestic workers or include them into the existing labour legislations. Until there is a law to protect the domestic workers, the abuse will continue. The Ministry will be calling for a meeting to discuss the Memorandum and will call on the MTUC to hear our views and concerns.
