

New Social Contract for Recovery and Resilience Union Wins March 2020

- Wage subsidy the ACTU campaigned for the government to implement a wage subsidy to prevent mass layoffs. On 30 March, the government announced the 'JobKeeper' scheme, paying \$1,500 a fortnight for a period of six months. The money is paid to employers and must be passed on to workers in full in the form of wages. The scheme was extended to March 2021 at a reduced rate.
- Social dialogue / legislation the government has set up five tripartite working groups to create a new workplace relations deal by late 2020. Before this, the government withdrew its anti-union 'Ensuring Integrity Bill'.
- Social protection the government announced the 'JobSeeker' payment on 30 March, which, for six months, replaced and doubled the old unemployment benefit that was set at below the poverty line. The government extended the payment beyond September at a reduced rate. In early September, the ACTU criticised the government for cutting back JobKeeper and JobSeeker, and called for a comprehensive national economic reconstruction plan.
- Free early childhood care was announced on 2 April. This temporary measure ended in July, but the ACTU is campaigning for it to become permanent.
